

Auction to help them Face the Future

WOKING Football Club is hosting an auction to raise money for the charity Face the Future.

The charity was founded by Alison Lane, of Southwood Avenue, Knaphill, after her son Jake, who suffered from Treacher Collins Syndrome, died aged three in November 2001.

Face the Future raises money for children like Jake who have facial deformities.
